Phone counselors speak English, Spanish, Haitian Creole and French. They counsel men and women by phone about recent assaults, medical and legal options, and they can accompany victims to the hospital and court-hearings. They offer assistance to friends of victims and information on how to help. They also have in-house groups for male and female survivors, adolescents, and bi-lingual groups, led by licensed counselors and clinical psychology interns.
