

Midyear in World Language

Midyear exams will vary (different languages, different levels, different number of years). They will typically include all four skills, although the oral section will take place at an earlier time than the midyear exam because of logistical reasons. Teachers will provide students with a list of what needs to be reviewed (vocab, grammar, unit, etc.).

The midyear exam is an opportunity to review, and solidify what students have learned throughout the first semester. For teachers, it is also an opportunity to find out what has stuck with the students, and what needs to be reinforced during the second semester.
